

Our next meeting is Tuesday, October 24th (NOT THE LAST TUESDAY) from 6PM-7:30PM


## Communication Guidelines



## Four Agreements of Courageous Conversation




### **Purpose - HOW to have the conversation**

- Stay engaged.
- 2. Speak your truth.
- Experience discomfort.
- 4. Expect and accept non-closure.

p.31 Recognizing that these agreements exist as a foundation for the conversation enables those who would normally feel unsafe in such a conversation to feel safer, even while experiencing discomfort.

## Six Conditions of Courageous Conversation



# Purpose - to outline the content and progression of the conversation

These are to be done sequentially.

### **ENGAGE**

- 1. Establish a racial context that is personal, local, and immediate.
- Isolate race while acknowledging the broader scope of diversity and the variety of factors and conditions that contribute to racialized problems.

### SUSTAIN

3. Normalize social construction of knowledge, thus engaging multiple racial points of view in order to surface critical perspective.

## Six Conditions of Courageous Conversation




4. Monitor the parameters of the conversation by being explicit and intentional about the number of participants, prompts for discussion, and time allotted for listening, speaking, and reflecting. Use the Courageous Conversation Compass to gauge where you and other participants are in terms of your emotional, intellectual, moral, and relational proximity and connection to a given racial topic.

### DEEPEN

- 5. Establish agreement around a contemporary working definition of race that clearly differentiates it from ethnicity and nationality.
- 6. Examine the presence and role of Whiteness and its impact on the conversation and the problem being addressed.

## Four Agreements of Courageous Conversation



Used to determine the place of engagement at which each participant in the dialogue is processing the content.

Emotionally - feeling
Intellectually - thinking
Morally - believing
Relationally - acting



## Four Agreements of Courageous Conversation



### **Navigating with your compass**

- 1. Locate Self: From which quadrant(s) am I entering the conversation?
- 2. **Get Centered:** Which quadrant(s) am I not yet experiencing, and how will I deepen my engagement to experience all quadrants?
- 3. "See" Others: In which quadrant(s) is my conversation partner located?
- Meet Others Where They Are: Engage with your conversation partner, initially, in the quadrant(s) in which they are located.

### **Grants to Communities**

Community organizations may apply to the Town for financial and in-kind support of projects, programs, and events. The grants assume an annual cycle to allow for appropriate budgeting and planning. The <u>online application</u> for the 2024 grant cycle will open September 1, 2023.

### **Award Criteria**

All applications for Grant Awards will be reviewed based upon how well the stated purpose for the request serves the Town's residents in relation to general criteria that is stated in the <u>policies and procedures</u>.

### Eligibility

Eligibility is restricted to applicants which are:

- Recognized community service organizations organized and federally designated for tax purposes as non-profit corporations (501c3).
- Chartered chapters of state or national lodges or service organizations that engage in charitable or community service activities.
- o Public schools located in Erie.

### **Application**

Applications for funding are accepted from Sept. 1 through Nov. 30 for funding of events or programs in the following year. Requests must be submitted online using the <u>Grant Application</u>. Recipients of grant funds will receive notice of award by January 30, 2024.







In hindsight this was not a good question and would have been better as two separate questions.






### **QUESTION THREE**


This is so great! Our children will benefit greatly from exposure to other cultures and practices - don't stop at Indian culture :)

This is exciting! Im eager to learn more.


None.

### A perspective from a concerned parent

Made sure it was clear that not all of India celebrates Diwali. Diwali is of Hindu origin and not all Indians are Hindu. Also, Indian celebration of Diwali differs based on geography as well as religion.

Requested making sure that we represent different aspects of Indian culture

Do we want to move forward with this?

**Unanimous vote - YES** 

**Date: Wednesday November 8.** This date is clear on the school calendar, is a few days before Diwali, and doesn't conflict with Veterans Day

**Time: 5:30 to 7:30PM** (this was the time frame for the Hispanic Heritage month celebration and seemed to work well for families last year)

Location: School gym and cafeteria (since it's November, we will need to be inside)

Format: We would like to incorporate food, activities, music and dance.

This is the same night as restaurant night - need to contact PTO/FSO.

### Food:

- 1. Two food trucks, parked outside near the doors. People can bring their food into the cafeteria to eat.
- 2. The parent offered to prepare Chai tea (two versions, one with dairy one without) and a lemon tea (caffeine free). This would require access to 2-3 large urns.
  - The district may have urns or we may be able to borrow from the community.
- 3. There is a sweet called Laddu that is very famous during these celebrations. We would like to purchase the sweets, possibly from a local home cook who makes and sells them during Diwali
  - We can purchase from a home cook

**Current approved plan** 

### **Activities:**

- 1. **Scavenger hunt:** Create a scavenger hunt for people to go around within the gym and cafeteria area and read various signs about the history of Diwali and other facts about India. Ideally we'd love to invite the 4/5th grades to help create the scavenger hunt through a lesson in the days before the event.
  - o Mr. Garcia is checking with Ms. Mirto to see if she would like to facilitate this for the kids
- 2. **Lamp craft:** Because Diwali is the festival of light, we can have a station where kids create a lamp <a href="https://www.womplestudios.com/blogs/div/diwali-paper-lantern">https://www.womplestudios.com/blogs/div/diwali-paper-lantern</a>
- 3. **Rangoli craft:** <a href="https://theeducatorsspinonit.com/rangoli-craft-idea-for-kids/">https://theeducatorsspinonit.com/rangoli-craft-idea-for-kids/</a> or <a href="https://kidworldcitizen.org/kids-rangoli-art-for-diwali-chalk-colored-sand/">https://kidworldcitizen.org/kids-rangoli-art-for-diwali-chalk-colored-sand/</a> (adapted for indoors)
- 4. **Henna:** we would like to look into a local Indian henna artist to provide henna art for the kids

**Music/Dance:** We could have a DJ playing music, and a dance instructor teach a short dance. We could possibly also have a dance performance depending on our budget. The parent knows of a dance teacher who may be able to connect us with a DJ and dancers.

**Lights:** We could hand out glow sticks at the end of the event to celebrate the theme of festival of lights.

## Additional ideas from Indian parents

An Indian Red Hawk parent expressed concern about the scavenger hunt. They want to make sure that the history of Diwali is communicated accurately. This would be where the religious part could come into play. Ideas on this?

One suggestion is to pivot from Diwali and instead include famous/inspirational people who come from India - for example the Google CEO

### **Question for Tim**

Does Red Hawk plan on letting the kids know what Diwali is? If so when and how?

Tim had a schedule conflict and was unable to be at the meeting.

- Recommendation to reach out to Mrs. Laskar, a school para, about the celebration. She has shared aspects of Indian culture with her class in the past.
- To make sure to comply with district guidelines, vet any crafts, song lyrics, etc. to make sure that there isn't a religious component
- Discuss further the possibility of including the community.
- Potentially reach out to other local EDI committees? Include Indian community somehow? 0
- Wednesday 11/8 is an FSO restaurant night discuss with them
  - Parent has offered to make chai tea and lemon tea this would be free Offer one kind of traditional free dessert.
